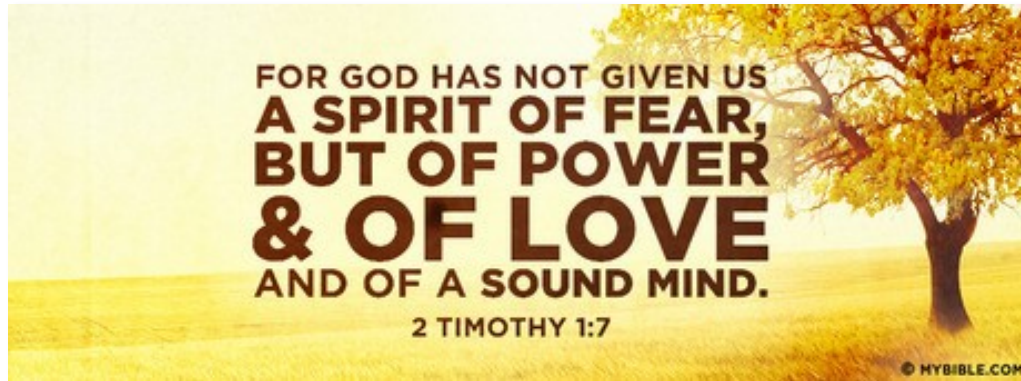

DUAL-CREDITS

- U of R Accelerated Program** — Did you know you can complete University of Regina classes while still in grade 11 or 12? UR Accelerated is offering ENGL 100 or Anthropology 100 in 2020. You can earn university credits and a high school credit. The course runs in second semester. The fee is \$911 plus textbooks. The deadline to apply is December 6, 2019. - DynalIndustrial Bursary** — DynalIndustrial is committed to an annual \$1,000 bursary to a qualifying First Nation/Metis student for the University of Regina, UR Accelerated Program. The window for applications is **October 18th - November 29th**.

Dual Credits for future Early Childhood Educators can be earned by high school students. Grade 11 and 12 students who complete 3 specific **Saskatchewan Polytechnic's Early Childhood Education** courses will also receive credit towards their high school graduation. These courses will be offered through distance education options. With the successful completion of the 3 courses, students will be eligible for the Ministry of Education's Early Childhood Educator I certification.
