Preparing our children for success starts early.

### **Preparing Your Child:**

- 1. Read, read, and then read some more! The more books your child is exposed to the better.
- 2. After you read together, ask your child different questions about the characters, setting, or plot. Comprehension is a key component in learning to read.
- 3. Whenever you read a new book together for the first time, ask your child to predict what they think will happen next.
- 4. Letters are all around us. Point out different letters everywhere you go-signs, cereal boxes, mail etc.
- 5. Play "Go Fish" using alphabet cards. This is a great way to practice identifying letters.
- 6. Practice writing the names of other family members. Tracing, copying, or even creating the letters from objects are great ways to do this.
- 7. Count, count, and then count some more!
- 8. Practice printing and copying different numbers. Get creative!

Also, remember that children learn through play. Provide as many opportunities as possible for creative play. Talk to them about what they are playing. Role play and foster imagination!

# A Kindergartner Should Know:

Before entering Kindergarten, there are some key things your child should endeavor to know:

- ☑ Their first and last name
- ☑ Their parents first and last names
- ☑ How to print their name, beginning with a capital, followed by the lowercase letters
- ☑ Their telephone number and address
- I How to clean up their toys when they have finished playing
- ☑ They should be able to perform simple household tasks. For example: setting the table
- ☑ How to go to the bathroom, flush toilet, and wash hands independently
- ☑ They should be able to draw a picture, and then tell a story about it (even if it just looks like scribbles to you)
- ☑ They should be able to sit and listen while someone reads them a story
- ☑ They should be able to play nicely with other children and be able to share
- ☑ They should be able to zip up their own jacket and get dressed for outdoor winter play.



### The First Day:

Many different feelings can be present for both students and parents on the first day. As an adult you may feel excited, and also feel a sense of loss. You may feel worried about many aspects of your child heading off to school. Your child may also feel worried, as well as excited and ready for a new adventure — especially if they know what to expect.

#### **BEFORE THE FIRST DAY:**

Talk to your child about their new school, their teacher's name, and new routines. Get your child used to a healthy bedtime and morning routine that will be necessary for a good school day. Enough sleep and good nutrition play an important part in a students learning.

#### THE FIRST DAY:

It's important that parents remain calm and try not to be overly worried or excited for your child. When you say goodbye make it *quick*, *light*, *and reassuring*. An upbeat, "have a great day and I'll see you in a little while." is a good way to part. If you feel a temporary sense of loss, plan a special activity for yourself to look forward to. Experience tells us that parents often have a more difficult time than their children on the first day of Kindergarten!
